

Tri County Community Network - Kid Fit



Kid Fit continues to be an amazing success. Each event hosted at least 150 children, caregivers, and volunteers over the course of the past year. So many families from Big Valley to Round Mountain (about a 60 mile stretch of highway 299) attend and enjoy time together. It is a powerful and amazing experience, and we are so thankful to be able to offer this program to our community.

Many parents have approached us thanking us for providing fun and free activities for their children over the summer. However, my favorite time is when we drew the name for our grand prize winner of a two night stay at the Great Wolf Lodge. A young boy, whose family had attended every single Kid Fit event, won! When we called his name, his whole family erupted in excitement. They all started jumping up and down and cheering as he accepted the prize. The mom gave me a big hug and said "Thank you so much. We have always wanted to take the kids there but it was too expensive. Thank you for giving this gift to our family."

The goal of Kid Fit is to create opportunities for families to come together and spend time with their children, but it also means so much to us that we could also give a family a once in a lifetime vacation together.

Spay and Neuter Intermountain Pets & Pet Placement (SNIPPP)



This grant provided funding for our Free or Low Cost spay/neuter voucher program for dogs and cats. Due to need, the funds were used for cat vouchers and provided for the spaying of 54 female cats and the neutering of 42 male cats. These spays and neuters help reduce cat overpopulation in the intermountain area, and result in healthier cats.

Each female cat can produce up to 15 kittens a year, and unneutered male cats can impregnate countless unspayed female cats. Over the course of 8 years, 1 female cat and her male mate can produce an unbelievable 2,072,514 cats! These numbers are based upon one unspayed female, her mate and all of her offpring, producing 2 litters per year, with 2.8 surviving kittens per litter.

Mercy Foundation North - Connected Living



In the Burney area, Connected Living delivers 650 meals each month to homebound older adults and serves 300 meals each month at its congregate dining location in Burney. Connected Living also delivers 750 meals each month to the Pit River Tribe and their associated Day Care. There is no charge for these services so grants from BRCF make a real difference. These funds have allowed DHCL to do more outreach and ultimately serve more people in need.

Local resident Lillie shared that she had been feeling down and then Joe, a Meals on Wheels driver, came into her life. Joe makes Lillie's bad days a little better. She expressed that, "At this age, with so many different things happening, you feel kinda bad." She shared how her life has changed over the years, including the passing of her husband and friends. Without Meals on Wheels, Lillie said, "It would be a very lonesome life."

Mountain Valleys Health Center



A BRCF grant was used to purchase EKG equipment and support software to improve patient care and increase accessibility by reducing the need to travel to other locations for services. The Health Center serves over 3,000 patients annually from the surrounding area and a large majority benefit since 45% are age 55 and older, and 38% are uninsured or on Medi-Cal.

MVHC replaced outdated equipment which caused bottlenecks in workflow due to slow performance and inability to provide results electronically. The previous equipment was being phased out due to age, so these funds ensured our continued ability to provide lifesaving EKGs in the clinic.
