COVID-19 Relief Fund Disbursement Report

In response to the 2020 Coronavirus pandemic, the COVID-19 Relief Fund was activated by Shasta Regional Community Foundation. This fund is addressing the needs of our region's most vulnerable residents.

Grants Distributed

Funds have been distributed from the COVID-19 Relief Fund in the form of grants to local nonprofits and government agencies. The following list reflects all distributions made to date:

- \$3,000 – Food purchases through Siskiyou Community Food Bank (Yreka) – 3/24/20
- \$4,000 – Food purchases through Siskiyou Food Assistance (Weed) – 3/24/20
- \$5,000 – Food purchases through Corning Christian Assistance (Corning) – 3/24/20
- \$5,000 – Food purchases through Living Hope Compassion Ministries (Redding) – 3/24/20
- \$10,000 – County-wide distribution of food including staff, fuel, and vehicle cost through Great Northern Services (Weed) – 3/24/20
- \$10,000 – Cost-reduced childcare to essential workers through Shasta Family YMCA (Redding) – 3/24/20

\$1,000 – Mobile hot spots for telehealth sessions and mental health survival kit delivery through Hill Country Community Clinic (Round Mountain); at the direction of ConnectGen – 6/10/2020

\$4,000 – Mobile hot spots for student internet access and food/staffing costs for summer food program through Montgomery Creek School (Montgomery Creek); at the direction of ConnectGen – 6/10/2020

\$25,000 – Hire Business Recovery Specialist to implement programs assisting local small businesses in recovery through Forward Redding Foundation – 6/25/2020

\$2,325 –Purchase protective equipment (disinfecting sprayers and tabs, plexiglass walls for box office and concession sales) through JPR Foundation to support the Cascade Theater – 6/25/2020

\$13,500 –Fund Siskiyou Farmer’s Market matching program to support local farms and residents experiencing food insecurity through Siskiyou County Job Council (Siskiyou County EDC) – 6/25/2020

\$500 – Supplement summer lunches for children with fresh produce through Mt. Shasta School Café – 6/25/2020

\$1,757 – Fund a public Wi-Fi hotspot for community members, including those trying to access Hornbook’s Mutual Aid Network through Hornbook Community Association – 6/25/2020

\$5,000 – Food purchases in Tehama County through The Salvation Army – 6/25/2020
