1. What is the Community Foundation of the North State's Zogg Fire Relief and Recovery Fund?

The Zogg Fire Relief and Recovery Fund is enabled to receive donations for those impacted by the 2020 Zogg Fire in the Igo and Ono communities and surrounding areas.

2. Why donate through the Community Foundation of the North State?

The Community Foundation of the North State is credible, transparent and connected. We are the same organization that accepted, and disbursed donations from the Community Disaster Relief Fund in response to the 2014 Boles Fire in Weed and the 2018 Carr Fire in Redding. The Community Foundation knows that the impact of the Zogg Fire presents a huge challenge for the residents of Igo and Ono to meet their needs for recovery from this disastrous event. We are a nonprofit, public charity serving the people of Shasta, Siskiyou and Tehama counties, with a mission to impact the region through the power of giving. Since 2000, the Community Foundation has awarded over \$34 million in grants, made possible by the generosity of our fund holders and professional fund management practices.
