



COMMUNITY DISASTER RELIEF FUND Disbursements to Date

In response to the 2018 Carr Fire, the Community Disaster Relief Fund was activated by Shasta Regional Community Foundation. 100% of donated funds are directed to Carr Fire recovery efforts, no fees will be assessed by the Community Foundation.

Grants Distributed

Funds distributed from the Community Disaster Relief Fund are in the form of grants to local nonprofits and government agencies. Requests are reviewed and approved by staff, a community grant review panel and approved by the Community Foundation Board of Directors.
