

Siskiyou Outdoor Recreation Alliance (SORA) raised \$5,212 this year, just over their Giving Tuesday fundraising goal. Donations help support programs at SORA, like the Equipment Lending Library, which makes well-maintained outdoor recreational equipment available on a sliding scale or no-cost basis to serve low-income and disproportionally impacted populations in Siskiyou County.

Connor was one of the first kids to receive a bike through SORA's Equipment Lending Library. He checked out a Talen 2 Hardtail Mountain Bike and is excited to participate in the spring and summer Shasta Gravity Adventures Gravity Grom Bike Programs.
